## EDITORIAL

Welcome to the April edition of the Brookwood newsletter.

Spring is slowly creeping up on us, and with the lighter evenings it's good to see a few more people out and about on the heaths and along the canal. It would seem that we already have some new visitors to the village in the shape of a pair of swans on the canal along with a pair of Canadian geese. Hopefully they will settle and raise some young. With this in mind the Canal & River Trust published an article about the dangers of feeding bread to young waterfowl. It seems that feeding ducks bread could be damaging their health and habitats.

The Canal & River Trust charity estimates that, each year, six million loaves of bread, equal to 20 double decker buses full, are being thrown into canals and rivers in England and Wales, potentially polluting the water. Bread can also be harmful to a duck's health as it is the equivalent of junk food to a duck's diet. The uneaten soggy bread can also cause a build-



up of bad nutrients, creating harmful algae that can spread disease and attract pests such as rats.

In response the Canal & River Trust has published a free information pack detailing how to feed ducks responsibly by swapping bread for

more natural treats such as oats, corn, defrosted frozen peas and even a bit of limp lettuce. For more information visit the Canal & River Trust website: <https://canalrivertrust.org.uk>.

# UPSTARTS ART CLASSES

Have you ever wanted to try your hand at drawing the human form?

Life and portrait drawing has been regarded for centuries as one of the main stays of art, and an essential aspect of any artist's, professional or amateur, artistic education.

If you have ever thought you would like to give this challenging but rewarding activity a go now is your chance.

Upstarts art classes run a life and portrait drawing session on a Monday evening at Brookwood School between 8 and 10pm. This is a drop-in session so there is no need to book; just show up with your chosen drawing or painting medium. The session is facilitated by a fully qualified art teacher and working artist. The sessions are designed to accommodate all levels from the total beginner up to the professional.

The cost is very reasonable at only £12 per session. There is also an option to book for the whole term, if you wish, which would reduce the cost to £10 per session, £50 for the term. Our next term commences on Monday 13 April 2015 and will run for five weeks, three weeks prior to the May bank holiday and two weeks after.

Teas and coffees are supplied before the start of the class as well as during it and, for those not watching their weight, biscuits are also available.

We like to think of our sessions as an opportunity to practise the art of figure and portrait drawing/painting in a relaxed, non-pressured and social environment.
