NEIGHBOURHOOD FORUM AGM



The Brookwood and Bridley Neighbourhood Forum (BBNF) AGM took place on 30 July in the Memorial Hall and was attended by about 30 residents.

Cllr Kevin Davis, who chaired the meeting, said that the work of the Forum had been put on hold while a response to Woking Borough Council's sites allocation proposals had been prepared. See the August newsletter for details of the proposals as they affect Brookwood. The meeting warmly endorsed the response and thanked those responsible for putting it together. The BBNF response was forwarded to the Council the following day.

BBNF is devising a second questionnaire to inform draft development plans. It is likely to fall on your doormat in early October.

There was a brief discussion on the proposal to double stack part of the Brookwood station car park (as reported last month). Cllr Kevin advised that SW Trains could not be prevented from doing this and residents needed to work with the rail authorities to try to make the best of the situation.

There is a proposal to open a new gate at the east end of the cemetery to allow pedestrian access to the station for people living in the Heath House Road area.

Kevin is standing down as Chair of BBNF and a new Chair will be needed from September. If you are interested, please contact Kevin on cllrkevin.davis@woking.gov.uk.

LETTER FROM A COMMUTER

I just wanted to share with you a nearmiss situation with a motorcyclist and my car recently. In your last newsletter there is an article on the station car park. One point missed on this is the danger to cars leaving the station and turning right. As you leave, immediately to the right are allocated parking spots. Recently a large van has remained parked at this closest spot to the station. This has completely blinded the vision to vehicles leaving the station. Yesterday as I was leaving, assuming the oncoming path was clear as a car had just passed on the main road from the left (only one car can go through at a time), I nudged forward only to find a bike coming through. The bike did nothing wrong in my opinion but there was a very near miss as a result of him/ her swerving to avoid my car.

Going back to the article referred to above, the last paragraph makes a really valid point about reversing the entry points to the station as to my knowledge there is no blind spot this way around. I know of one other exact same incident and therefore hoping somehow highlighting this via the community newsletter may get something in place to change something to stop a near miss becoming a head-on collision at some point. In my opinion neither the bike nor I was at fault in this situation but somehow I feel one of the two would be put at blame. I was just making an innocent journey home from work.

(This letter was received at the end of July and the van has since been parked further away from the station exit but the principle of impaired sight lines remains and Cllr Kevin and SW Trains have been made aware. If other people have had similar experiences please let the newsletter and Cllr Kevin know.)


NEWS FROM BROOKWOOD CLUB
