CHRISTMAS AT ST SAVIOUR'S

This Advent, Caroline, Ben and Jo of the Holy Trinity and St Saviour's Church staff will be just one group of many who will be sleeping out in spaces transformed into Advent 'stables'. The idea is to have fun and raise sponsorship money that will help Church Urban Fund reach out to some of England's most marginalised people.

Dressing as Mary, Joseph and the Angel Gabriel on the evening of 13 December, the team will walk the streets of Knaphill – perhaps visiting a few 'inns' along the way – and eventually coming to rest at a pre-fab stable that will be their shelter for the night in front of Holy Trinity Church in Chobham Road.



The team are looking forward to the challenge but realise that for them this will be just one night of sleeping without proper shelter, whereas for many it is a daily and seemingly endless struggle. Caroline says, 'As well as homelessness, many people may be

facing debt, isolation, addiction, abuse or violence. Whatever challenges they face, the Advent Sleepout Challenge will help the Church Urban Fund reach out to even more people, offering practical solutions to help transform lives locally.'

Jo added, 'We will be sleeping outdoors, whatever the weather, but perhaps looking forward to a few visitors bringing supplies of hot chocolate! If they'd really like to get into the spirit of the event, perhaps they'd like to come dressed as shepherds, kings or angels?' So, if you see some strangely dressed characters out and about on the night of Sunday 13 December why not stop and encourage the team by leaving a donation for the Church Urban Fund?
