END OF YEAR REPORT – BROOKWOOD SCHOOL

It's the end of another exciting and successful year at Brookwood Primary. We continue to enjoy the support of many friends from the village, for which we are very grateful, and love seeing you at various events and on the occasions that we bring the children out into the community.

As well as sending another group of youngsters off to secondary school in good shape and making great progress with all the others, we've managed to fix the clock and improve the fabric of the school in other ways, not least sealing a few leaks and upgrading some of our outside play areas. We've built a new website too. This year we've launched a new curriculum, called the International Primary Curriculum, which is challenging our children to explore some very exciting areas of learning and new topics. PIRBRIGHT ARMY TRAINING CENTRE AWARDED FREEDOM OF THE BOROUGH

Woking Borough Council awarded Freedom of the Borough to the Army Training Centre, Pirbright, at a Special Meeting of the Council on 8 December 2016.

The Freedom of the Borough recognises exceptional contributions, or distinctive service to the Borough, by an individual or group of individuals. During the Special Meeting Cllr Anne Murray, Mayor of Woking, presented a ceremonial certificate to mark the occasion to representatives from the Army Training Centre. Cllr Murray said: 'The Honour of Freedom of the Borough is not lightly awarded and signifies the esteem that the services and soldiers of the Centre are held in.'

The Army Training Centre is based at the Alexander Barracks in Pirbright. Established in 1875, the Centre delivers training to over 5,000 new recruits and reservists each year. The 14-week course prepares all adult recruits, both male and female, over the age of 17, for service. They will then go on to join a wide range of Military Corps and Regiments, in which they will hone specific skills for their chosen Army trade.

On St George's Day, 23 April 2017, there will be a formal public presentation of a velum scroll. The Centre will be invited to march through the Borough, with Colours flying, bands playing, drums beating and bayonets fixed.
