BBNF MEETING

The neighbourhood Forum held its AGM on Thursday 21 September at St Saviour's Church Hall. The Committee was re-elected en bloc. Mark Craven, the chair, invited anyone who is interested to join the committee and he thanked Gordon Bishop for all the work he has done to support the Forum.

Mark reported that the detailed DRAFT Neighbourhood Plan had been submitted to Woking Borough Council for comment. When it is returned it will be reviewed by the committee and consultants before completion. The Committee was satisfied that the draft was as comprehensive as possible at this stage. It is a detailed and lengthy process, but it is hoped that the Plan will be complete next autumn.

CLlr Kevin Davis gave a resume of current issues in the village:

Coblands Site: The planning application has been delayed because of land acquisition issues. It may be some time before building starts there.

Crossroads Work: The Council had conducted a consultation and it seemed the amendments to the crossroads (which should improve the flow of local traffic) were generally acceptable. Planners were now looking at the detail of the scheme.

Pirbright Tunnel: At the other end of the village, Kevin acknowledged the queuing problems especially during rush hour. However, this is an issue that needs to be tackled by Guildford

(not Woking) Borough Council. He is encouraging the County Councillor for the area to take it up.

Parking Proposals: The proposal to have a double yellow line on Connaught Road between the station entrance and exit had been welcomed. Other parking proposals were still under discussion.

Cala Path: now bonded and generally acceptable. Still some concern about possible flooding which Kevin is taking forward.

SANG: the area between the canal and the Brookwood Farm estate is designated as a SANG – Suitable Alternative Natural Green Space – and as such is protected under European law. It therefore cannot be built on. Woking Borough Council is managing it with mown pathways. It needs a name! Currently 'Cowshot Country Park' is the front runner, after the name of the stream, but if you have any better ideas Kevin would be pleased to know.

The Meadows Building: has been sold by the NHS and acquired by a care home operator.

Brookwood Village Signs: the two signs at either end of the village have gone AWOL. The meeting was keen to have them re-instated but funding was an issue.

MUSEUM OF MILITARY MEDICINE



How many times have you driven past Keogh Barracks at Mytchett and thought, 'One day I'll go and explore there'? Four of us from the village spent a morning at the museum in the summer, and came away astonished at the information and heroics it contains.

Medicine in the army has long been 'cutting edge' and some of the earliest experimental operations took place on battlefields. The exhibition chronicles the history of the four army medical corps. The details of conditions are undoubtedly harrowing at times, but one is also impressed by the ingenuity, skill and bravery of doctors and nurses, dentists and vets. There are a number of touching personal stories which really bring the exhibition to life. For example, this year is the centenary of the death of Captain Noel Godfrey Chavasse (1884-1917), a doctor in the Royal Army Medical Corps who holds

the rare honour of two Victoria Crosses for bravery. On the second occasion he was severely injured whilst attending a patient during the opening battle at Passchendaele and he died from his wounds.

As well as the serious content of the exhibition, there are some weird and wonderful exhibits and a mind-boggling story about Rudolf Hess who was detained at Mytchett but refused to give his name!

The museum is free but you need to show photo ID at the gate. I am not convinced it is for primary school children, but older students and adults interested in medicine and/or military history will find it fascinating. We are so lucky to have it on our doorstep, but make a point of visiting soon as it is moving to swanky new premises in Cardiff in 2020

NEWS FROM PIRBRIGHT SURGERY

A Flu Clinic is being held at Lord Pirbright's Hall on Saturday 14 October from 10am to 12noon. Drop-in times will be done by surname basis: A-K from 10 to 11am, and L-Z from 11am to 12 noon.

The Friends of Pirbright Surgery, a Patient Participation Group formed four years ago, is seeking new members.
