BROOKWOOD LYE ROADSHOW

On 9 February Cllr Kevin Davis wrote:
Roadshow

The Brookwood Lye Roadshow on Wednesday 7 February was a big success in my opinion. I was at the Memorial Hall, along with representatives from Thamesway and the architects. Sixty-three people, plus a dog came along and saw an impressive video visual walk through the plot, and had the opportunity to look at the plans and ask whatever questions they wished. Unsurprisingly, the crossroads was the main area where people had concerns and I'm grateful that there was no opposition to the actual development and some good suggestions as to how some areas could be improved. We know the crossroads are going to have some improvements done, which I hope will be completed either before, or during the development build out. The crossroads has been approved at the SCC/WBC Joint Committee, but the final plans are still being worked up.

Earn Your Deposit Scheme

On 8 February, at full Council, we passed a paper called 'Earn Your Deposit Scheme'. EYDS is an attempt by WBC to provide genuine help to aspiring house buyers by allowing them to build up a steady deposit while renting a property from Thamesway. At the roadshow, it was very well received, especially amongst the younger generation,

Resurfacing


BROOKWOOD CLUB
