## VOLUNTEER OF THE YEAR



Congratulations to Trudi Fletcher, one of the newsletter team, who recently received the Greenoak 'Woking Volunteer of the Year' award. She was nominated by Cornerhouse in Woking, which promotes mental and emotional wellbeing. Cornerhouse nominated Trudi in recognition of the work she does as a volunteer to facilitate the anxiety release group that helps get people back on their feet. Trudi was presented with a cheque for £100 by Jonathan Lord MP.



For the last few years, Trudi has also been running the Christmas Woking Foodbank campaign which helps people who are in crisis. Last year over 150 bags of food weighing in at approximately 1 ton were donated and most of them came from Brookwood! This food helped vulnerable people, including single parent and abused families, cope over the Christmas period. The Salvation Army delivered around 90 of these parcels and added extra Christmas goodies for the children.

It only seems a few weeks since we were enjoying the blazing summer and it's hard to believe that it won't be long before Christmas is here again. It's therefore a good time to start thinking about how we can help others this year in the run-up to Christmas. A really easy way to do this is to just add a few non-perishable items to your list on your next few shopping trips. You can leave your donations with the staff at Brookwood Club or Brookwood Bakery, who have kindly offered to take them while they are open from the last week of October until the end of November. Donations need to be made a little earlier this year to provide the Salvation Army with more time to get the parcels out in good time for Christmas.


Trudi has asked that you leave a label with your name and contact details on any donations

## GUILDFORD IN HARMONY CONCERT

Surrey's Oakleaf Enterprise's Guildford in Harmony charity concert will bring together local choirs for an evening of uplifting music on Saturday 24 November from 7pm at Guildford Baptist Church. Oakleaf is a mental health charity working to provide its clients with vocational training and social activities to help them boost wellbeing and confidence, which may lead to mainstream employment.

The concert will be introduced by Dame Penelope Keith, who has been Patron of Oakleaf for the last 18 years and is a strong supporter of mental health awareness across the county. Oakleaf's CEO, Clive Stone, is a strong advocate of choir singing, and is even part of Bellow Fellows, one of the choirs performing in the concert. Other choirs performing include: Guildford Vox, Guildford

Jazz Choir, Oakleaf's Everyman Choir, and Guildford County School's Chamber Choir.

Clive says: "Singing has been one of the best things I have done for my own mental health and it is great to see others reap this benefit. I just wish I had started many years ago, instead of in my 50s." Recent studies show that singing, especially in a group setting, can be highly beneficial to mental wellbeing. It helps reduce stress and build confidence. It also gives people who are isolated a reason to socialise, meet others, and gain a sense of belonging.
