#### ROAD WORKS

We have all been painfully aware of the work that has been happening at the west end of the village for the last few months. At the time of writing, the road under the railway bridge is due to reopen in late February with a four-way temporary light system in place until 21 March. It is assumed that the work to complete the pavement from St John's Court to the end of Connaught Road will take place some time after these temporary traffic lights have been removed. Let's hope that the new pavement on Connaught Road, the planned improvements to drainage and creation of a safer crossing place for pedestrians make all the disruption worthwhile.

# BROOKWOOD NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN

Some readers may remember the 'Brookwood and Bridley Neighbourhood Forum'. The objectives of this were:

- a) To improve the area known as Brookwood and Bridley (the Neighbourhood Area) for the benefit of individuals living and working within the Neighbourhood Area and local business organisations.
- To promote the social, economic and environmental well-being of the Neighbourhood Area.
- c) To prepare in partnership with the Local Planning Authority a neighbourhood plan for the Neighbourhood Area.
- d) To encourage the goodwill and involvement of the wider community.
- e) To foster community spirit and encourage civic pride.

The forum has become dormant in recent years, but we need to revive it so that we can have a say in local planning and in updating the Woking Borough Neighbourhood Plan,

which is due in 2027. We also need to have an active Neighbourhood Forum in order to benefit from Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) spending, which has a small budget for local improvements and which has been mentioned in previous editions. The area to be covered is the Brookwood polling district (that is the homes using the Brookwood Memorial Hall polling station).

This is a call for a few (5–9) volunteers to join a Brookwood Neighbourhood Forum and help to put together proposals for spending CIL money and updating the Brookwood Neighbourhood Plan. Once we have a core group of volunteers, we will get help with the details of the process from Woking Borough Council. The aim is to make this as painless as possible by focusing on updating the original plan.

# **SURREY COUNCIL CHANGES**

In December 2024, the Government proposed the creation of more Mayoral Strategic Authorities in areas like Surrey that don't currently have one. This approach means that additional power is given to the local communities who know their areas best, giving them more control over decision-making and implementation of services.

The government also outlined plans to create more unitary councils to simplify and streamline local government. At present, Surrey has a two-tier council system, with 11 district and borough councils and a county council. As a result, different services are currently delivered by the district and borough councils, and the county council.

The government expects all two-tier areas to reorganise in the coming years, and has confirmed that Surrey will be on an accelerated programme to do so. If Surrey were to move to a unitary model, the county and district and borough councils would all dissolve and a new unitary council or councils would deliver all the services. We could also see a new Strategic Authority created, led by a new Mayor. This could cover the whole of Surrey, or Surrey could join together with neighbouring councils with a Mayor sitting across a larger geography.

It has also been confirmed that Surrey's County Council elections that were due to take place in May will be postponed until 2026; this will enable the detailed work for reorganisation and devolution to take place.

## AARON'S ADVENTURE ARCHIVE

Nine-year-old villager, Aaran Harle-Hosein, has a YouTube channel covering his interest in train travel. Aaron's Adventure Archive features episodes on local train history including the St Edward Brotherhood train museum in Brookwood Cemetery, the Beeching Axe stations of Ash Green Halt and Tongham Halt, the Farnborough RAE street railway of 1917–1967, the Bisley to Blackdown abandoned railway of 1890–1952 and a farewell to Ash level crossing.

#### SHEETS HEATH



Sheets Heath is a SSSI (Site of Special Scientific Interest) and is managed by the Surrey Heathland Partnership. The heathland is home to three types of rare birds that nest throughout the spring and summer months: woodlarks, Dartford warblers and nightjars. These birds nest on the ground or in low-growing vegetation, in open areas of heather and gorse from

March until September. It's especially important to keep dogs under control, as birds are easily scared off their nests. It's not necessarily that dogs hunt the birds, but, if the birds repeatedly leave their nests, they'll eventually abandon them.
