
ROADWORKS ON GOLE ROAD AND DAWNEY HILL

Following the disruption at the start of the year when the Pirbright tunnel was closed for the installation of pelican crossings, we might have hoped for a period of stability. But work has now started on a major modification to the Dawney Hill road between the tunnel and Caterham Close.

The modification will widen the road to three lanes, one heading south and two heading north towards the tunnel junction. The northward inside lane will be dedicated for traffic wishing to turn left onto Gole Road (presumably with a left-turn filter). The modifications are being done in the expectation of increased amounts of traffic using Gole Road once the 1200 new houses have been built at Deepcut (part of the Mindenhurst development). The scheme also includes improved footpaths, a layby area, an informal pedestrian crossing and an enhanced bus stop (see plan of the works).

The works will take until April 2026 (22 weeks) and Dawney Hill will be reduced to a single southbound lane for the duration. Northbound traffic will be diverted to use the A322 Bagshot Road from Fox Corner. As a result, the 28 and 91 buses will not be running on Dawney Hill or in the west end of Brookwood until April 2026. The nearest stop for these buses will be at Brookwood station. See

CANAL TOWPATH CLOSURE



As reported in our last edition, the 3.4-km section of the Basingstoke Canal towpath between Brookwood and Deepcut (Locks 15 to 28) has been closed to the public until 30 December to allow the surface to be levelled, the banks to be stabilised and the drainage to be improved. We're pleased to report that the work is proceeding well and the first stretch past Howfield Cottage has now been re-opened. The footpath crossing at Cowshot Bridge remains open to allow pedestrian access between Pirbright Camp and Pirbright village.

BROOKWOOD LYE UPDATE - TRAVELLERS' SITE

As we reported in April 2024, Woking Borough Council served an Enforcement Notice in January 2024 on the owner of the Travellers' site. He appealed this to the Planning Inspectorate (a central government agency) and an Appeal Hearing was held on 23 April 2025. The Planning Inspectorate ultimately agreed with the Council's assessment and dismissed the appeal on 28 April 2025. This means that the

Enforcement Notice is extant from that date and it has a compliance period of 2 years. The landowner therefore has until 29 April 2027 to fully comply with the requirements of the notice.


BROOKWOOD LYE UPDATE – THAMESWAY HOUSING DEVELOPMENT

A consultation response in mid-November 2024 from the ecological advisor (Surrey Wildlife Trust Ecology Planning Advice Service) to the Local Planning Authority (LPA, Woking Borough Council) raised a number of concerns with the ecological information submitted by ThamesWey Group with the planning application. ThamesWey's ecological consultant has been undertaking additional ecology surveys on the site but, due to access difficulties and to some seasonal species (e.g. in hibernation), it has taken almost a year to complete. It is hoped the additional survey report will be submitted to the LPA in October 2025 and that a decision by the Council's Planning Committee will then follow fairly soon.

DEFIBRILLATORS IN BROOKWOOD

In an emergency, could you locate one and use it? Many are listed on a website run by the British Heart Foundation (www.defibfinder.co.uk). You enter your location, and it brings up a list and a map of the nearby defib machines with their addresses and when they're available for use. A few of the nearest ones to us include Brookwood station carpark (24/7), West Hill Golf Club (8am-6pm), and Pirbright Green Cricket Pavilion (24/7). But there are two additional defibrillators in Brookwood that are not listed on the BHF website. One is on the front wall of Brookwood Club and the other is on the wall of the Small Memorial Hall (opposite the door into the Main Hall).

These machines are very easy to use and the modern ones talk you through each stage, step by step. The St John's Ambulance website is another good source of hints and tips on using the machines. Go on! You could save a life!

CWGC MEMORIAL TO THE MISSING

The Commonwealth War Graves Commission is building a new Memorial to the Missing at Brookwood Cemetery. This memorial will commemorate those who died in the United Kingdom and Ireland during the First World War and currently have no known final resting place. The original Brookwood 1914-1918 Memorial honoured some of these individuals. However, as ongoing research has revealed more names to commemorate, and the final resting places of others commemorated on the previous memorial were identified, it became clear that a new memorial was needed. Initially, 400 service personnel will be commemorated on the new memorial. As research progresses, additional names will be added, with space available for up to 1,200 names.

The names of the missing will be engraved on Portland stone stelae. These stelae will be arranged to mirror the stars as they appeared in the night sky on 11 November 1918 – the day the war ended. In stone and sky, their memory continues to endure (https://www.cwgc.org/ourwork/brookwood-1914-1918-memorial/).

CONNAUGHT CRESCENT PLAYGROUND UPGRADE

On 9 October, Cllr Leslie Rice met a group of residents at Brookwood children's playground, behind Connaught Crescent, to discuss the improvements that might be possible using community funds that have been set aside for Brookwood. Several ideas, such as a sunken trampoline and a larger climbing frame, were suggested, as well as a safer surface area; the current one is mossy and slippery in places. There was also a discussion about the problem of vandalism and illegal use of the park after dark.
