# BEAUTIFUL NEW HEDGE AT FOX CORNER COMMUNITY WILDLIFE AREA



A stunning new front hedge at Fox Corner has recently been laid in a traditional Surrey style by the Surrey Hedgelaying Group using the existing hedge of blackthorn, hawthorn, hazel and other varieties.

Surrey Hedgelaying Group has been active since the beginning of the 1980s and is a semi-professional organisation specialising in hedgelaying and taking on laying some very overgrown hedges,

Traditional hedgelaying involves using the existing stems of trees, and partially cutting through the stems, bending them down horizontally near ground level (called pleaching), which encourages new growth from the base and creates a living fence. Then wooden stakes are inserted into the middle of the hedge to offer support. Finally, willow or hazel binders are woven in and out of the stakes to secure everything in place. The skilfully layed hedge will develop over the next year or so as new growth forms, and will provide a haven for wildlife and birds.

You are invited to come and see this beautiful old art close up and perhaps to visit the wildlife area too with its 14 acres of streams, a pond, wetlands, woodlands and meadows. Being a local nature reserve, it provides a diverse environment for many different species of animals, reptiles, flora and fauna. The new hedge will enhance the site's natural habitats.

# BROOKWOOD CEMETERY – THE TORSO MURDERS

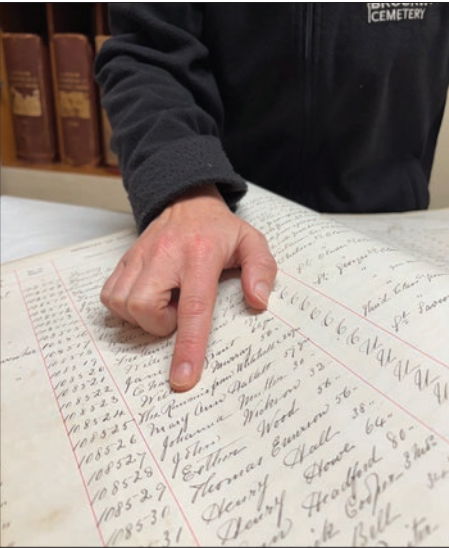
A chilling new docuseries, Victorian Murder Club, premiered this January, drawing viewers into the shadowy world of Victorian crime. At its heart lies the story of a forgotten serial killer, the infamous Thames Torso Murderer, whose gruesome acts shocked London in the late 19th century.

Presented by acclaimed historian Lucy Worsley, the series reopens this historical cold case, tracing the fragmented clues that remain. Her investigation led her to Brookwood Cemetery, the final resting place of two victims whose lives were brutally cut short.

In the opening episode, aired on 5 January 2026, viewers watched as Kim Lowe, Chair of The Brookwood Cemetery Society, guided Lucy through the London Necropolis burial records, which confirmed the arrival of the dismembered remains at Brookwood.

The victims’ identities were shrouded in mystery due to the horrific nature of their deaths, with records referring simply to “The remains from Whitehall” in 1888. Yet, one name emerged from the shadows: Elizabeth Jackson, a 24-year-old woman buried in a pauper’s grave in 1889.

For those captivated by Victorian intrigue, the full story unfolds in this gripping three-part series, now available on BBC iPlayer.

**Mausoleums Walk:** Join Jon Leech as he unlocks some of the cemetery’s notable mausoleums and tells the stories of those within.

Details of walks later in the year will be published in future editions but one of particular note is the new Restricted Mobility – South Side walk planned for 7 June. For the first time, Kim Lowe will reveal the lives of people who lie within easy reach. This will be for people with restricted mobility and their carer only.

# SHEETS HEATH PAVILION

In February 2024, Woking Borough Council adopted a community asset transfer policy to enable the community to take control in running assets to best meet local need, to support the voluntary and community sector to meet their growth ambitions, and to sustain and revitalise the assets at a time of increased budget pressures on the Council.

Sheets Heath Pavilion was listed as one such asset and last year approval was given to transfer the Pavilion to the Meadow Sports Football Club and Woking & Horsell Cricket Club.

These clubs currently provide recreational sport for a combined 1,000 members. Established in 1965, Meadow Sports provides football for boys, girls and young adults from

U6s up to U23s and is a leading grassroots football club within Woking borough. Woking & Horsell CC, established in 1905, is the borough’s largest cricket club and provides cricket for men, women, boys and girls from the age of 6 years upwards.

The two clubs are creating a new organisation to operate the pavilion which will ensure its use all year round, with football concentrated from September to April and cricket from May to August. The intention is also to provide a local community hub to be available for hire for small meetings or community gatherings during the week, primarily on weekdays.

The timetable for completing the formalities is not yet known, but we look forward to updating readers in a future edition.

## HONOURING THE FALLEN OF THE FIRST WORLD WAR

The Commonwealth War Graves Commission is building a new Memorial to the Missing in Brookwood. This memorial will commemorate those who died in the United Kingdom and Ireland during the First World War and currently have no known final resting place.


The original Brookwood 1914–1918 Memorial honoured some of these individuals. However, as ongoing research has revealed more names to commemorate, and the final resting places of others commemorated on the previous memorial were identified, it became clear that a new memorial was needed.

Initially, 400 service personnel will be commemorated on the new memorial. As research progresses, additional names will be added, with space available for up to 1,200 names.
