WOKING LEISURE CENTRE REFURBISHMENT

Woking Leisure Centre is set for a major refresh, with refurbishment work starting in phases from late February after a £1.2 million investment. The improvements, being carried out by Everyone Active on behalf of Woking Borough Council, will focus on upgrading the gym, group exercise studios and spin studio.

The spin studio will close from 23 February until mid-March, followed by the group exercise studios from 2 March. The gym will then close from 16 March, with this first phase of works due to finish in early April.

There's plenty to look forward to, including brand-new life fitness and hammer strength equipment, more squat racks and benches, new treadmills and Wattbikes, and improved functional training areas. The cycling studio will get new Keiser bikes, plus upgraded lighting and sound, and virtual spin classes will be introduced. A new fascial stimulator will also be added to support recovery.

While work is under way, members can use Woking Sportsbox and Eastwood Leisure Centre

The first half of the term was rich with learning experiences beyond the classroom. Chertsey Museum visited us to deliver interactive history workshops, bringing the

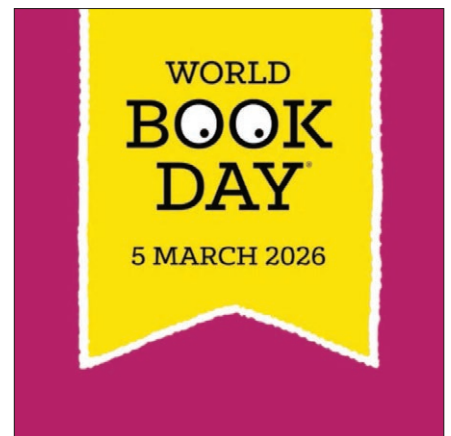

We are also preparing for World Book Day on Thursday 5 March. This much-loved event always brings plenty of excitement, with pupils and staff looking forward to celebrating stories, reading and creativity together.
