Councillor responsibilities until 1 April 2027

Existing county, district and borough councillors

- responsible for all current council services
- responding to residents about council services
- support a smooth transition to the new councils

Newly elected 'shadow' councillors for East Surrey and West Surrey

- agreeing the structure and budgets of the new councils
- agreeing how the councils will operate once they formally begin
- responding to residents about the new councils

Dale and I were both also elected to the Shadow Authority Cabinet. His portfolio is "Transformation, Digital and Customer Experience"; this covers the practical redesign of how residents interact with the new council, which will be formed from seven legacy local authorities, alongside the broader organisational transformation needed for the transition to Vesting Day in April 2027. My portfolio is Finance, which includes procurement and contracts for all the Council's services, including Adult Social Care, SEND, Highways, Facilities Management, etc.

West Surrey becomes operational next April 2027 to serve 650,000 residents. Until then, your Surrey and Borough Councillors will continue to serve our community.

The Friends of Brentmoor Heath is a new volunteering group working at Brentmoor Heath & Folly Bog nature reserves, near Bisley. Led by Surrey Wildlife Trust's brilliant Voluntary Warden Nick, the group are working hard to protect the heathland – a vital haven for reptiles like grass snakes, common lizards and slow worms, as well as the rare Dartford warbler – through monthly weekend sessions. The group will be continuing their efforts to protect the heathland by removing scrub and bracken throughout the next few months, but will be starting off their autumn with a survey session at the start of September so they can fully understand the impact they will have on the site.

BROOKWOOD CEMETERY HISTORIC MAUSOLEUMS HERITAGE OPEN DAY

Visitors will have a rare opportunity to peek inside some of Brookwood Cemetery's historic mausoleums on Saturday 12 September as the site takes part in the Heritage Open Days 2026 campaign. Usually closed to the public, the mausoleums offer a fascinating glimpse into Victorian funerary architecture and the stories of those commemorated within them. Alongside

the open mausoleums, visitors can enjoy self-guided trails of notable graves, a free guided walk, refreshments, picnics among the cemetery's wildlife and wildflowers, and entry to the cemetery's iconic Columbarium.
